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## Dear Reader.

When I began writing to incarcerated environmental and animal rights activists in 2006, I asked them: "Where are the places you travel to inside your minds eye, the sacred places that you visualize that help to keep you sane? I offered to be their eyes. I asked them to tell me how to find their actual places, the time of day to visit. "I'll go there to make a picture for you," I wrote. "And I'll describe the place to you."

This was the beginning of a long collaborative project that has taken me from the Pacific Northwest to the Arizona desert, from the South Dakota Badlands to the Atlantic Ocean. As a photographer, I sometimes secretly yearn to be liberated from everything I know about the history of art and photography. I want to be reckless and make beautiful photographs that celebrate nature. Instead I work toward resuscitating a clichéd genre -- nature photography – while acknowledging that nature and politics will always be inextricably bound together.

In 2001 the Federal Bureau of Investigations targeted the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) and the Animal Liberation Front (ALF) as the number one domestic terrorist threat in the United States. Before that time, the US government had no credible evidence to seek indictments for unsolved environmentally motivated crimes, mainly arsons that happened across the American West from 1996-2001. During these actions, no one was ever harmed because every precaution was used to protect the lives of others, a signature of ELF and ALF. The people responsible for these actions eluded federal agents for years, but after 9/11 the FBI's budget was abundant with resources and the Joint Terrorism Task Force's power was emboldened by the United States Patriot Act.

Operation Backfire, one of the largest investigations of environmental and animal liberation activists in American history, began on December 7, 2005: A single informant entered into a secret plea agreement with FBI and cracked open the case –18 people were indicted and dozens of suspected activists were subpoenaed to testify before grand juries in Eugene, Oregon. Grand juries have the power to subpoena witnesses into testifying without a lawyer present in order to gather evidence against a suspect. One activist was detained for six months for refusing to testify.

The defendants were charged with conspiracy, arson and use of destructive devices. By filing destructive device and conspiracy charges and employing the Domestic Terrorism Enhancement Act, the Federal government was able to threaten the indicted environmentalists with multiple life sentences. Under pressure from prosecutors, the activists accepted plea bargains in exchange for leniency.

Of the eighteen defendants who were indicted, nine accepted the prosecution's plea agreements and co-operated, four negotiated non co-operation plea deals, four became fugitives, one was arrested in 2011 following his expulsion from China. The one remaining, Bill Rodgers an environmental and social justice activist was arrested and took his own life while in custody prior to his arraignment.

In his suicide note, Rodgers wrote: -

"Certain human cultures have been waging war against the Earth for millennia. I chose to fight on the side of bears, mountain lions, skunks, bats, saguaros, cliff rose and all things wild. I am just the most recent casualty in that war. But tonight I have made a jail break -- I am returning home, to the Earth, to the place of my origins."

Bill, 12/21/05 (the winter solstice)

The 'Green Scare' is what the activists call the current situation. It's the 'Red Scare' of our generation. Whether or not you agree with their values or tactics, the Green Scare raises critical questions about the powerful influence governmental and corporate control has over our lives, the wild and the future of the planet.

The news about the Green Scare hit me deeply. I understood the reasons why the activists did what they did but it wasn't enough for me to read about it in the media. I began going to Eugene, Oregon in the fall '06 to witness the court hearings. I met with the defendant's spouses, friends, co-workers, families and the local people who supported them. Through these relationships I felt a close kinship to the prosecuted activists and I wanted to do something in their defense.

These seven individuals were caught in the Green Scare. Their stories, the letters from our correspondence and the photographs I made comprise this project.

Daniel McGowan and Jonathan Paul are two of the four defendants who took non-cooperation deals stemming from the 'Operation Backfire' investigation.

Jonathan Paul was recently released after serving four years in federal prison for his role in the 1997 arson of Cavel West, a horse slaughterhouse. In Redmond, Oregon. The Bureau of Land Management captured wild horses and sold them to Cavel West where they were slaughtered and sold as meat for human consumption in Japan and Belgium. For ten years the Redmond community

campaigned through letter writing and demonstration, trying to close down Cavel West. The killings were brutally slow and agonizing; blood from the slaughterhouse clogged the local water system. Paul's action destroyed Cavel West and shut it down permanently. He states that his action was not politically motivated; he simply wanted to save the wild horses.

In a 2009 letter, Jonathan Paul wrote -

"Yes, some of the things I have participated in have been considered extreme, but I was only acting in response to an extreme situation. I acted in defense of those who had no voice, and in order to do so I had to go above the laws that our society has made in order to protect those who destroy the planet for profit. Although I would never advocate others to do the same. I do know for me I do take pleasure knowing there have been and are animals living free of exploitation and suffering because of choices I have made."

Daniel McGowan was sentenced to seven years for his 2001 involvement in two direct actions; Superior Lumber and Jefferson Poplar. McGowan is still serving time in a highly restrictive terrorists prison unit ambiguously called a 'Communication Management Unit' (CMU). An experimental penal program housed within two maximum-security prisons, these units specialize in isolation depravation and restrict a prisoner's connection to family and outside communities. The majority of the CMU prison population is of Muslim descent.

When McGowan and I began our correspondence, he was housed among the general prison population. Now, McGowan's letters give a rare personal glimpse into a secretive world that very few people know exists. His good-natured spirit remains resilient in spite of the punitive restrictions imposed on CMU inmates; McGowan stated, "Visiting is limited to one 4-hour, non-contact (through glass) visit a month that is recorded and live monitored by staff. Again, to compare, I had 56 potential hours a month of contact visiting! Yikes, it was incredibly painful to see Jenny through glass- to not be able to hug her or smell her perfume and hair. Sigh." He signs off in his letter, "Love from Iil Guantanamo".

Prior to 'Operation Backfire', I was aware of Jeffrey Luers, a nineteen-year old environmentalist from Downey, California and an activist since 1996,

As Luers explained in the 2006 documentary, 'The Jeffrey Luers Story':

"I have given my entire adult life to activism. I've never really known anything else. I dropped out of college to devote 40 + hours a week working for the Sierra Club. I left the Sierra Club to get involved in grassroots activism. I found myself moving to Eugene, Oregon following a path I believed would lead me to my

destiny. I became involved in civil disobedience and militant activism, ultimately living in an old-growth tree (Happy) to protect the ancient forest. It was in that tree that I decided to dedicate my life to revolution."

In the Willamette National Forest, Luers established the 'Fall Creek' tree sit campaign in March '98. The forest defenders successfully saved 96 acres of old growth forest from a local timber company. 95% of the old growth forest in the Pacific North West has been destroyed, leaving only 5% of standing native forest.

During the summer of 2000, Luers and Craig Marshall set fire to three light trucks at a car dealership in Eugene, Oregon. It was a drastic action, intended to create a media spectacle and inspired by their desire to raise awareness about the real dangers of greenhouse carbon emissions: the massive United States car fleet is the world's second largest producer of greenhouse carbon emissions, causing climate change and mass extinctions.

Luers and Marshall, already under surveillance by a joint counter terrorist unit, were immediately arrested. Marshall took a plea deal and served five years. Luers went to trial. Convicted of first degree arson, attempted first degree arson and manufacturing an explosive device, he was sentenced to 22 years and 8 months. This is the longest sentence ever handed down in an environmental economic sabotage case. At the car dealership, the property destruction was estimated at twenty eight thousand dollars; and two of the three trucks were later repaired and sold.

After serving 10 years in a maximum-security prison, Luers won his appeal and was released in December '09.

In a statement to the court during his trial, Luers said:

"I want to make clear why I set fire at Romania Chevrolet. I'm not going to offer excuses. I want this opportunity to explain my actions so that they are not misunderstood or misinterpreted.

I didn't do this for anarchy or because I'm anti-government. And I didn't do this because I enjoy property destruction. I don't.

I did this because I'm frustrated that we are doing irreversible damage to our planet – our home. It is not an exaggeration to say that right now we are experiencing a period of extinction equal to that of the dinosaurs. Forty thousand species are going extinct each year. Yet we continue to pollute and exploit the natural world.

I'm not going to justify my actions. I can't do that anymore than one can justify the destruction of the environment for profit. They are both wrong.

I take responsibility for what I've done. You can judge my actions, but you can't judge my heart. It cannot be said that I'm unfeeling and uncaring. My heart is filled with love and compassion. I fight to protect life, not take it"

Jake Conroy was sentenced to four years for a controversial case involving six animal rights activists convicted of conspiracy under the Animal Enterprise Terrorism Act (AETA). Running an above ground website, 'Stop Huntington Animal Cruelty', SHAC established a effective world wide campaign that advocated for the closure of Huntington Life Sciences (HLS), an animal testing lab that kills between 71,000 and 180,000 animals annually as part of the animal testing industry. Since 1981, animal rights campaigners, journalists and members of the public infiltrated HSL exposing repeated animal welfare violations.

SHAC reported on protests against HLS and the companies, suppliers, and affiliates who supported them. The website also ran an awareness campaign, informing the public about the lab and encouraging a boycott of companies doing business with them. Ultimately, HLS shares plunged and the company was dropped from the New York Stock Exchange. The pharmaceutical industry, however, lobbied AETA legislation and protects businesses profiting from the exploitation of animals. The AETA criminalizes animal rights activists for non-violent civil disobedience protest and First Amendment rights. It silences dissent.

Rodney Coronado is a longtime environmental and animal rights activist. In 1985, when he was just 19, he joined the crew of Sea Shepherd. Throughout the 90's, Coronado participated in radical direct actions with ALF and ELF. In 1995 he was convicted of arson. Coronado served five years in Federal prison for an action at Michigan State University's fur research facility, destroying years of data that benefitted the fur industry.

I began corresponding with Coronado in 2006 while he was serving an eightmonth prison sentence for interfering with the United States Forest Service's mountain lion hunt in Sabino Canyon, Tucson, Arizona.

Soon after his release in 2007, Coronado was prosecuted under the newly legislated laws of domestic Federal terrorism: in a 2003 lecture, he had demonstrated the use of an incendiary device. During the question and answer part of his talk, an audience member asked him how he made the incendiary device for the MSU action Coronado gave a very brief answer that was recorded by undercover Federal task force agents who were in the audience.

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The Federal government spent years organizing the case against Coronado. Although the trial ended with a hung jury in his favor, the prosecution had tapes of all his previous speeches. Prosecution threatened to build a Federal case around each lecture; conviction could result in a sentence of 20 years to life. Coronado, a family man with a wife and two children, accepted the plea agreement before his second trail. He served another year in prison and was released with probation restrictions that exceeded average conditions. He was released in December 2008 but was convicted again, serving four months in August 2010 for violating his parole because he accepted a friend request on Facebook from an environmental activist, Mike Roselle.

Marie Mason was sentenced to twenty-two years in February, 2009 for the 1999 arson of a genetic engineering researcher's office at Michigan State University. It was an action that took place at night while the building was empty. At Michigan State, Monsanto and United States Agency International Development were funding controversial engineering: a radical new kind of seed developed with an inability to generate future seeds, the engineered seed could force poor farmers into endlessly purchasing new seeds. Mason was convicted of arson and destroying logging equipment. She is now serving the longest conviction of the Green Scare defendants.

In her 2009 sentencing statement to the court, Mason said:

"I want to explain that the more I learned of the consequences of deforestation and genetic engineering, the more desperate I felt. Genetic engineering research is often conducted in open air situations that release contaminated pollen into the environment with devastating effects, as is the case in terminator seed plants, and communities should have the right to choose or refuse such risks that come with GMOs. What I was more aware of in my research and in my dealings with indigenous activist work around the globe is that the use of GMOs forced on communities by collusion between banks, companies and governments was causing starvation and death and environmental damage through contact with GMOs. And I felt so much grief for this needless suffering and these needless deaths, mostly of the infirmed and very young.

The threat posed to all of us by global warming, for which the world's forest act as a buffer against, is direct and dramatic. The increase in catastrophic storms that caused so much death and destruction in New Orleans and in many parts of Asia are attributable directly to the erratic warming of the planet. Forest sequester carbon and cool the planet, and as we loose them, we lose the time we need to find new and more sustainable ways of fulfilling our energy needs before global climate crisis is unavoidable".

In a 1997 campaign to close down five fur farms in the Midwest, Peter Young spent two weeks releasing between 8,000 and 12,000 mink into their native habitat. He was indicted in accordance with the Animal Enterprise Terrorism Act, and charged with unlawful interference with interstate commerce. After living as a fugitive for seven years, he was arrested in 2005 and took a plea agreement. Young was sentenced and served two years in prison. Peter Young's activism continues through lecturing and his website <a href="https://www.animalliberationfrontline.com">www.animalliberationfrontline.com</a> that reports on animal rights issues.

Environmental degradation continues unabated: forests recede, species go extinct, icecaps melt, and the sea level continues to rise.

I have redacted several passages because they were off the record or I want to protect the privacy of others.

Hey Kelly -Here is the first chaft of what I wnote My intention was to re-write it and "fill it out" more, but as I re real it, I thought its make as a first draft might be more in the spirit of the project. If you think its too rough or that I should emphasing any particular point, please do not hisitate to let me know. of course, this is the only copy. I left the prison yesterday and are in things writing for my live to Frand Rapide. Ill de at a halfman house, but diet mail ar eatle Hope you wil fell get the New Year up to a great start past let me know if I can help w/ anything whi! Red

Sorry it feller such a long time since live written, the last few months in here have been tolerable, but still him having any usual hard time at being away from my family especially my son his spent abot of time in secont mecho thinking adout your project and I have this letter will become something that you centil inc. I have long been thinking of my contribution being like my other should pust write a letter telling upon what has been going on inside me, inside here. So, here & am, again in Jekeral prison, the sames prison I notically spent time in 14 years ago when I was first extendited to muchigan for my first festeral case. A inhole different winted back then, just meeke after having ended my time underground with a puture 4 years in prison to come Back then, I was the first animal liberationist to be in federal prison. Now I am just another of the many. and while person hasn't changed that much, I know that I have. My path to person began about 25 years ago when I prist chose to be a part of a movement that would insh imprisonment in the name of defending the Earth. For a child who loved this land and the arrivale on it and who was coming to terms with what our present day society was doing to the natural mortal, my empletion seems reasonable. What differentiated me from the many others like me who chase lines and professions protecting the enveremment abbeit legally, I largely accrelit to my heritage as an meligenous person, but equally a student of U.S. history. a student who learned early what price our civilization is willing to pay to attain wealth and progress. And atthough the roots of such imperation can be travel back further than the inception of this nation, my personal connection to the suffering of my luman relations on this continent has made me extremely empathetic to the suffering of the land and animale here. So as a mitness to the injustices of my cum generation, the path of physical resistance to such armes against mature was only natural. I came to age as a young adult as a student of Beronmo and Paul Watson. Why wenters were historically Crayy Horse and Sitting Bull, but also contemporary levelers such as Dave Foreman and Cleveland among. In retrospect, I can now see how that time was an annakening. I have been following the situation regarding your incarceration and feel outraged and haunted by the insanity of a perverted justice system gone horribly wrong. I am completely inspired by your character and strength and want to introduce myself to you. I am an artist from Los Angeles.

I make work about the environment. My direct actions are through art. I believe in Angela Davis's quote, "Progressive art can assist people to learn not only about the objective forces at work in the society in which they live but, also about the intensely social character of their interior lives. Ultimately, it can propel people toward social emancipation". I want to believe in Davis's words, because it gives me hope.

My work looks at the interconnectedness of natural and cultural history. I've been working in the field with wildlife biologists and ornithologists making an epic photographic project about the birds of North America. This project was inspired primarily as a critique about the depoliticized representation of wildness.

When I need to calm my mind I close my eyes and think about the Painted Desert and the Badlands. The fantasy is a variation about wide-open spaces interrupted by buttes and mesas, changing constantly in the light. I like to loose myself watching the hawks and ravens circling overhead, seamlessly drifting on a thermal. The silence and vastness always soothes me and makes me feel like things are going to be okay.

Where are the wild places you travel to inside your mind's eye? Where are the sacred places that keep you sane? I could visit those places for you and make pictures to send to you. Let me be your eyes. Tell me where to go and which vantage point to photograph as well the time of day. I'll go there and make a picture for you and describe the place to you.

This is an invitation for collaborative project, which has the promise to raise awareness and support. It's also an opportunity for you to enter into a discourse that extends beyond your day- to-day reality. I'm contacting other incarcerated environmental activists with the same request. I'm hopeful that you'll accept my invitation.





Thank you for getting in touch. I appreciated you letter and your poster images very much. Powerful work.

I regret that my time today is short and this will be a little less than the letter you were kind enough to send, than the letter I would like it to be. I want you to know I included your artwork into my photo album where it now has a permanent home.

I am interested in learning more about your project, as well as the responses from other prisoners. After weighing on your question re: the places I travel to in my mind's eye to deal with the insane world of prison, I have come to a couple of answers which I will share with you.

There is nothing that quiets my mind more than the sun setting over the Pacific. I have lived near the ocean most of my life, first being born and largely raised in Silicon Vally and travelling to the coast every weekend. Hater living in Seattle, from the ages of 9 to 21. And on to my last moments in the free world - I was on the beach at 1pm and in a San Jose jail cell at 8. Dusk on the beach, any beach. If I had to choose, I would choose the northern Oregon coast or the beaches south of Santa Barbara.

Next, I think of the Badlands in the rain. You mentioned the Badlands, but that in no way influenced this selection. The Badlands in the rain is a profound experience.

Devils Tower National Park in Wyoming is also among my favorite places anywwhere. There is a creek that runs through a grassy field at its base (unsure which direction), and it is one of my favorite places anywhere.

Hastly, Montana's Bitteroot Mountains. Anytime.

Unfortunately this library is closing and I am forced to end here. Please let me knowi if you would

like more detail and I will respond.





Evidence of rehabilitation must be considered, including certificates of good conduct and certificates of relief from disabilities. If denied employment or licensure based upon a conviction, the applicant is entitled to a written statement of the reasons for denial, N.Y. Correct, Law §§ 750-

6. After an individual has been convicted, does the state offer any mechanism to demonstrate that an individual has been rehabilitated?

Certificates of relief from disabilities and certificates of good conduct are offered and automatically lift occupational bars. Certificates of relief from disabilities are available to individuals with any number of misdementor convictions but no more than one felony conviction. Separate certificates are necessary for each conviction. Temporary certificates are available while on probation or parole, and become permanent unless revoked. N.Y. Correct. Law §§ 700-03. Following waiting periods that vary based upon severity of the offense, certificates of good conduct are available to individuals with any number of misdemeanor convictions and two or more felony convictions. One certificate will cover all convictions. N.Y. Correct. Law §§ 700 and 703-b.

Individuals convicted of felony offenses who are on probation or have completed their senten may vote. Incarcerated individuals and those on parole may not vote. N.Y. Elec. Law § 5-106(2).

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

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Captain Paul Watson: Our record speaks for itself. In 30 years of operations the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society has never caused a death or a single injury. We have never been convicted of a felony.

Yes we have sunk whaling ships, rammed whalers and drift netters, boarded poaching vessels and destroyed equipment used for illegal exploitation of the oceans and we believe that these are valid tactics.

Martin Luther King once wrote that violence can not be committed against a non-sentient object.

His Holiness the Dalai Lama has given Sea Shepherd a letter of support in praise of our record of non-

In fact Greenpeace supported Sea Shepherd actions when we rammed and sank the pirate whaler Sierra in 1979. The article about the Sierra ramming was written by me as the cover story on the Greenpeace Chronicles in September 1979.

I was co-founder of Greenpeace International in October 1979 after this incident with the Sierra. Greenpeace has worked with the group Earth First! and that group participates in ecotage i.e. the destruction of logging and construction equipment.

So why does Greenpeace separate itself from Sea Shepherd?

The answer lies more in politics than tactics.

As a co-founder of Greenpeace, I along with most other of the original member have been marginalized by the bureaucrats who now run Greenpeace. We are a threat to their leadership and especially a threat to their revisionism.

The vision and the passion that helped create Greenpeace are not welcome today in Greenpeace the corporation where the bottom line is to increase contribution revenues by presenting a wide appeal and taking measures to not be overly radical or to offend possible donors.

The truth is that the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society is more non-violent than Greenpeace. Greenpeace has suffered a few deaths and numerous injuries over the years due to not taking proper precautions. No sea Shepherd crewmember has ever been injured.

But the most significant testament to Sea Shepherd's superior record of non-violence is the fact that Sea Shepherd ships do not serve meat, fish, eggs or dairy products to the crew. The ships are vegan ships and not a single animal suffered or is killed to feed the crew.

Greenpeace ships serve meat, dairy products, eggs and fish. Greenpeace posted a You Tube video of Greenpeacers eating whale meat in Japan to demonstrate they are not opposed to whale as part of Japanese cuisine.

So who is more non-violent [less violent? - af]? Vegan Sea Shepherd crewmembers or steak and fish eating Greenpeace crewmembers?

## Question No. 3

Is Sea Shepherd willing to cooperate and work with Greenpeace?

Captain Paul Watson: The answer is yes. Sea Shepherd policy is to work in cooperation with anyone willing to work with us. We believe that strength lies in diversity of tactics and strategies.

We once worked with Greenpeace and I have attempted to work with them for years but they consistently refuse. It makes practical sense for the two groups working to stop illegal whaling in the Southern Oceans to work

Last year when Sea Shepherd found the whaling fleet first we gave the coordinates to Greenpeace. This year we also gave the coordinates to Greenpeace. This year we offered to share our helicopter with Greenpeace. They refused and they refused to reciprocate by providing coordinates to us. It's been very frustrating.

Sea Shepherd works in partnership with the Galapagos National Park rangers andd the Cocos Island National Park rangers. We work in partnership with the Ecuadorian National Police and with the Environmental Protection Agency in the United States. We work with numerous non-governmental organizations.

And we would like to work cooperatively with Greenpeace. The fact that we do not is not our choice - the decision was made by Greenpeace to refuse cooperation.

#### Question No. 4

The Japanese whalers accused Sea Shepherd of not returning their calls and intentionally prolonging the holding of Sea Shepherd crewmembers as hostages so as to prolong the story. Is this true?

Captain Paul Watson: Our crew requested to leave as soon as they delivered the letter. This request is included in the letter. The Japanese captain of the Yushiin Maru No. 2 made a huge public relations error when

he decided to hold the two crew as hostages. They could have been released at any time. The decision was with the Japanese whalers to do so.

There was not a single call from the Japanese government to the Sea Shepherd ship Steve Irwin during the time the men were held hostage. The Sea Shepherd office in Friday Harbor did receive demands from the Institute of Cetacean Research as conditions for releasing the crew. I did not respond to these demands because issuing demands while holding hostages is extortion. We responded to the Australian government by saying that the release must be unconditional.

Did Sea Shepherd take advantage of the situation to get publicity? Of course we did. This incident brought the issue of illegal Japanese whaling to the attention of the world. That is an objective that is part of our mission.

#### Question No. 5

Some journalists have asked why we do not accept that the Japanese whaling program is a legitimate scientific research program?

We do not accept it as a legitimate scientific research program. First because it is not science and secondly because it is not legal.

The Japanese Institute for Cetacean Research has not published a single peer reviewed scientific paper concerning the so called "research" they are doing in the Southern Oceans.

If there is any research involved it is marketing and product development research.

The International Whaling Commission has condemned the program as bogus research.

Targeting endangered species in a whale sanctuary in violation of the International Whaling Commission (IWC) ban on commercial whaling is illegal under the Convention of Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) and under the regulations of the IWC.

In addition the killing of whales is banned in the Australian Antarctic Territory by order of the Australian courts. In response to critics who say that the Japanese whalers are just trying to make a living, I can only say that elephant poachers, drug dealers and arms dealers are also just trying to make a living. Making a living is not a justification for committing a crime. Science is not a justification for committing a crime.

#### Question No. 6

Sea Shepherd has been accused by the Japanese whalers and Greenpeace of being an eco-terrorist organization?

We get called many things by many people but it's all really just name calling.

The Sea Shepherd Conservation Society has never had a crewmember convicted of a felony crime. We are not wanted for any crime anywhere in the world. There are no criminal charges pending against us. It's all just rhetoric and name calling and nothing to take seriously.

I myself am not restricted in my travels and I do not have a criminal record.

We have never injured a single person nor have we ever intervened against a lawful enterprise. We only oppose illegal activities as defined by international law.

Our advisory board includes scientists, lawyers, journalists, and celebrities including the former Australian Minister of the Environment Ian Campbell, the former Vice Chair of the IWC Horst Klienschmidt, Naturalist Farley Mowat, actors Pierce Brosnan, Martin Sheen, Richard Dean Anderson and Sean Penn.

None of these people would be supporting us if we were a "terrorist" organization.

## Question No. 7

Sea Shepherd flies the Jolly Roger, the pirate flag. Are you pirates?


We get called pirate, and it is an accusation that does not bother us much. In fact we kind of like it. First there is the romantic appeal of swashbuckling pirates and kids love the image, they love our flag and logo.

Second we do consider ourselves pirates of compassion in pursuit of pirates of greed.

There is sometimes a need to be a pirate if for nothing else because sometimes pirates are needed to stop pirates.

Back in the 17th Century when piracy was raging out of control in the Caribbean, it was not the British government or the British Navy that shut down piracy. Like politicians today, many were on the take and British merchants and even the crown had a vested interest in piracy.

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Benjamin Potts and Giles Lane were transferred from the Yushin Maru No. 2 to the Australian Customs vessel Oceanic Viking early in the morning at 0200 Hours Melbourne time (1300 Hours GMT). The two men were transferred to the Sea Shepherd ship Steve Irwin at 0930 Hours Melbourne time (2030 Hours GMT).

Both men were happy to be reunited with their shipmates and eager to return to chasing the Japanese whaling fleet in the Southern Oceans. "It did not take long before the whalers realized that they made a huge public relations mistake in keeping us on their ship," said Benjamin Potts. "We made it clear to them that Sea Shepherd was committed to stopping their illegal whaling activities."

Both men reported that although they were roughed up when they first boarded the whaling ship, that they were treated well during their time onboard. The only injury was a bruised wrist suffered by Giles Lane.

"Although we appreciate the concern that people have expressed for our welfare, it is important to remember that this is not about us." said Giles Lane. "It's about stopping this cruel and illegal whale hunt. The treatment that we received was trivial in comparison to the suffering that the whales experience at the hands of the Japanese whalers. They may have been rough with us but at least we were not harpooned, electrocuted and mutilated. This is not about us, it's about the whales."

The Steve Irwin is continuing its pursuit of the Japanese whaling fleet. "This is the 8th day that whales have not been killed," said Captain Paul Watson. "Every day that we stop the whalers is a victory. We will continue to intervene, harass, block, and obstruct the whalers at every opportunity."

The Steve Irwin is presently at 59 Degrees 46 Minutes South and 85 Degrees 59 Minutes east and on the tail of the Japanese whaling fleet. The Australian court has ruled that the Japanese whaling fleet cannot kill whales in Australian Antarctic Territorial waters. The Sea Shepherd Conservation Society is prepared to work with the Australian government to uphold the court's ruling to ban the Japanese fleet from Australian waters.

# Did Sea Shepherd Commit Piracy

The Japanese have accused Sea Shepherd of piracy and there has been talk about charging Benjamin Potts and Giles Lane with piracy. Will this happen?

Captain Paul Watson: It is not likely. It would be amusing if they did. Both Giles and Ben laughed at the suggestion. I've been accused of piracy so many times that I've lost count.

Because I ordered the men to board the Japanese whaler, the piracy charges would actually be directed at myself but like them, I'm not worried about any charges.

First because there is a question of jurisdiction? Where would such charges be laid? I can't see Australia charging us with piracy and we have no plans to visit Japan in the near future.

Second it is a charge that would not hold up.

The United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea defines piracy as:.

This is an excerpt from Section VII titled "High Seas"

Article 101 Definition of piracy

Piracy consists of any of the following acts:

- (a) any illegal acts of violence or detention, or any act of depredation, committed for private ends by the crew or the passengers of a private ship or a private aircraft, and directed:
- (i) on the high seas, against another ship or aircraft, or against persons or property on board such ship or aircraft;
- (ii) against a ship, aircraft, persons or property in a place outside the jurisdiction of any State;
- (b) any act of voluntary participation in the operation of a ship or of an aircraft with knowledge of facts making it a pirate ship or aircraft;
- (c) any act of inciting or of intentionally facilitating an act described in subparagraph (a) or (b).

As the captain of the Steve Irwin I sent two of my crew onboard the Japanese whaler Yushiin Maru No. 2 with a letter addressed to the Japanese captain.

The letter read:

To: The Captain of any Japanese ship Involved with poaching operations in The Australian Antarctic Territorial Economic Exclusion Zone.

My name is Benjamin Potts.

I am an Australian citizen and an unpaid volunteer on the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society vessel Steve Irwin

I have come onboard your ship because you have refused to acknowledge communication from our ship pertaining to your illegal activities in the waters of the Australian Antarctic Territorial Economic Exclusion Zone. I am not boarding your ship with the intent to commit a crime, to rob you or to inflict injury upon your crew and yourself or damage to your ship. My reason for boarding is to deliver the message that you are in violation of international conservation law and in violation of the laws of Australia. It is my intent to deliver this message and then to request that you allow me to disembark from your vessel without harm or seizure.

I am empowered to act to uphold these laws in accordance with the United Nations World Charter for Nature and the laws of Australia.

I am boarding you with the request that you please refrain from any further criminal activity in these waters and cease and desist with the continued killing of endangered whales in this designated Whale Sanctuary in violation of the IWC global moratorium on commercial whaling and that you cease and desist in continued violations of Australian law by killing whales within the territorial waters of Australia without permit or permission from the government of Australia.

This is a letter of intent and it explains the reason for the boarding and specifically states that the boarding is not for any reason that could be described as piracy.

I would welcome formal charges of piracy just for the opportunity to defend such a ludicrous charge. It would be incredible publicity for Sea Shepherd and because of the letter of intent, I and my crew would be acquitted.

With reference to the incident involving the Japanese whaler, it should be pointed out that the whalers held two Sea Shepherd crewmembers after assaulting them and tying them to the mast. They then held them against their will and then issued a letter outlining conditions for their release which is extortion. Added to this is the fact that the Japanese whalers are plundering the Southern Oceans and killing endangered whales in a whale sanctuary in violation of a global moratorium on whaling and are in violation of the ban on whaling imposed by Australia in the Australian Antarctic Territory it becomes clear that the real pirates are the Japanese whalers - not Sea Shepherd.

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

# **ARSON IN THE NEWS**

A spate of eco-sabotage oriented stories is making news this week, all centering on Oregon and the Northwest. Media sources and the FBI are filling the headlines with the "eco-terrorist" label again as they discuss an arson in Seattle and three eco-saboteurs in the courts.

Just last week, eco-arsonist Jeff Luers was given a more than 10 year reduction on his almost 23 year sentence for burning three SUVs. And as the *EW* goes to press, a jury in Tacoma debates the innocence of Briana Waters, the 32-year-old violin teacher who has pled not guilty to serving as a lookout during the ecologically motivated arson of the University of Washington horticulture building in 2001.

Waters is the only one of the accused arsonists to go to trial. Four members of the loose-knit group are featured on the Portland FBI's "Most Wanted" page, and a dozen have taken plea agreements with the federal prosecutors. Almost all of the group expressed regret for their use of arson as a tool at their sentencings.

On March 2, in the midst of the jury's deliberations for the Waters' trial, three multi-million dollar homes went up in flames in a Seattle suburb. The arsonists left a sign reading, "Built Green? Nope black!" and signed themselves the ELF (Earth Liberation Front), according to media reports. The homes were unoccupied, and no one was injured. The FBI has said the fires are being investigated as an act of "domestic terrorism."

Though the homes were billed as using environmentally friendly materials, the development was built near headwaters of Bear Creek, home to endangered Chinook salmon. Opponents to the development said not enough was done to protect nearby wetlands and that the development endangered nearby water sources and destroyed beaver dams and hiking trails.

The ELF is not an organized group. Rather, it is a designation some radical environmentalists use when calling attention to an ecologically motivated act of destruction. The UW arsonists also used ELF to credit the fire there.

Waters' attorney called for a mistrial, citing that the Seattle fires could influence the jury, but the judge denied the request.

Also on March 2, Oregon activist Tre Arrow pled innocent to charges of conspiracy, arson, attempted arson and use of destructive devices in U.S. District Court in Portland. Arrow had fled to Canada in 2004 and fought extradition to the U.S. A trial date of May 6 was set by U.S. Magistrate Judge Dennis J. Hubel. — Camilla Mortensen

#### -- Tre Arrow Arrives in Portland --

Tre Arrow will be given a warm "welcome back" to Portland by his many friends, family and supporters. Tre is a grassroots activist, known foremost for his environmental protection work in the forests of Northern Oregon. Following several years of peaceful activism by Tre, the U.S. Government labeled him an "eco-terrorist" and charged him with multiple counts of arson, conspiracy to commit arson, and possession of destructive devices (i.e. incendiaries).

Tre has been a prisoner for four years in Canada fighting extradition to the U.S., fearing that he would not be given a fair trial in light of the "eco-terrorist" label. Tre is awaiting trial in Portland, Oregon, vigorously fighting his criminal charges. Tre states, "As winter holds the land in its grasp, the bare hardwoods stand strong and beckon the spirit of Spring. Likewise, as my life enters a new season, my strength and life force are flowing through my veins and invigorating my body, mind, and spirit for the upcoming challenges. The time has come to prepare for trial in Portland. I am returning from Canada ready to assist my lawyers in this process."

Tre has consistently denied any guilt and always asserted that he is innocent of all charges. Tre states, "I have maintained my innocence from the onset of this ordeal. My legal team presented my plea for asylum in Canada based on the political persecution I am facing. But, it is abundantly clear that the Canadian Government is complicit in the atrocities and injustices perpetrated by the US government. My faith in the Canadian authorities to act with a conscience in a fair and objective manner has not been realized. The time has come to prove my innocence once and for all."

Tre's indictment came only after three other individuals were arrested for the arsons and began to cooperate with the government. Tre's defense team stresses his innocence and asserts that the three cooperating individuals are directing the blame on Tre to escape punishment. Tre states, "I am innocent of the charges that the U.S. government is trying to pin on me. Just as many activists have experienced, the government is targeting me because I have chosen to challenge the status quo — not because I am guilty." Cont'd

Tre continues to be known in Portland as the peaceful activist who climbed the ledge outside the offices of the Regional U.S. Forest Service headquarters in July 2000. Tre perched on that 9-inch ledge, 10 meters above the ground, for 11 days. This attracted local, national, and international attention to the former Eagle Timber Sale. Tre and other grassroots activists were ultimately so successful that the U.S. Forest Service canceled the Eagle timber sale. Today, the public continues to enjoy the forest in the Clackamas River watershed for its natural beauty. The forest functions as a back-up drinking water source for Portland and surrounding communities.

Tre's family, friends and supporters remark on his kindness, passion and positive approach to activism. Tre leaves a lasting impression on everyone who heard his simple, yet important, educational messages on social justice, the connection of people, animals, the earth, and how humanity should take care of the planet.

In addition to environmental activism, in Portland, Tre helped with animal abuse issues, worked as a childcare provider and ran as a Pacific Green Party candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives in 2000. Tre's candidacy garnered more than 15,000 votes.

Tre's sister Shawna Scarpitti is the family's spokesperson. "My family's hope is to get Tre's story known by the public to add to the movement calling for him to be released. He is an innocent man facing a life sentence in prison. Tre has been fighting extradition for nearly four years in British Columbia, Canada, and is now returning to face trumped-up charges for crimes he did not commit," says Scarpitti.

Tre adds. "I thank the wonderful folks in Canada who have become part of my family and helped in countless ways with my legal and personal needs. I thank you from the depths of my being and we shall meet again! To all those in Oregon and beyond, to all those helping to mount the needed support — I am coming home and will see you soon. I will be free, and I will be vindicated! In the words of Caitriona Reed, I declare, 'For the power of my anger, transforming itself into love, for the beauty and integrity of all life-forms, and for the bright energy of my passion for justice and the health of all beings. I bow to you in gratitude and touch the Earth."

On Thursday, February 28, environmental activist Jeff Luers' 22 years and 8 month sentence was reduced to 10 years. Mr. Luers was resentenced to 90 months for an admitted 6.16.00 arson that caused \$50K of reparable damage to three trucks and to 30 months for an alleged, but denied 5.27.00 attempted arson that caused \$0 in damage.

If Lane County Assistant District Attorney Hasselman had decided that Jeff could serve the 90 months for the admitted Romania fire and the 30 months for the Tyree non-starter concurrently, Mr. Luers would have been free to leave the courtroom with the rest of us at 9:30 a.m. because he has been incarcerated since his June 16, 2000 arrest, 92 months ago.

But Mr. Hasselman argued that Jeff should serve the 90 and 30 month sentences consecutively. Judge Billings agreed, even though he described Mr. Luers' statement as the most impressive he'd heard in 35 years as a lawyer, compared him to a returning war hero and heaped praise on Mr. Luers male lawyers, Hugh Duvall and Jesse Barton. [Judge Billings did not note Mr. Luers female lawyer, Lauren

As a resident of Lane County, I am disgusted that Mr. Luers did not walk out a free man on 2.28.08. It is not surprising that Mr. Luers was the most thoughtful defendant Judge Billings has encountered in 35 years - Mr. Luers was the most thoughtful and honorable man in the courtroom on Thursday.

Well known American Earth First! activist, Frank Ambrose, (who has been wrongfully accused of ELF actions in the past) told ELP he has been charged on three counts of arson and conspiracy to commit arson. Other people listed in the indictment include Marie Mason, Aren Berthwick, Stephanie Sultz, and an "unnamed participant known to the grand jury."

At this moment in time ELP is unaware of what has happened to Aren Berthwick or Stephanie Sultz, but we are aware that Maria Mason has also been arrested and is currently in custody in Ohio and is expected to be extradited to Michigan.

Hunade it sound like the BoP is protecting us from money theme hungry nomen who prey on prisorers! Yeah, a-ha! Personally, I don't neal the BoP to screen my visitors in order to protect me. Anython- I'm surry it didn't work out - and that you were rejected again, ist a month later. We'll have to meet in New York whon I'm released- around Dec 2012.

I am happy to continue to offer feedback on your book but it needs to be stated clearly that I am not working with you on this project nor receiving any finds from the book. This is a brious to you true but considering where I am going, I can see them perhaps taking issue with it. Jenny can explain more... I guess I will filly a in a bit.

Coming back from Linch on May 12 (2008), a cop told me I needed to go to "R+D' (receiving + dischage). Thinking I owed postage on a how of books I sent out, I grabbed a handful of stamps and went down there. The cop there gave me 2 boyes and told me I needed to pack all my shift up. It was really for strating because the look on his face wasn't good and he only gave me 45 minutes (to pack up & "Izmon the north). Preciosly, I had put in for a transfer based on my mother's illness (she has cirrhosis and is on a liver donor list). The cibe I was getting has this had nothing to do with that request. I brought my shift back, was put in the Stu (secure housing unit about the hole) and put on a bos the rext day. On the bus, I asked one of the cops where I was going and he said "ECI Marion's Communication Management Unit". This was May 13th

and after my detour through wisconcin, I find myself starting my third week in the hole at FCI Terre Haute. I could go any day or wait another month-it's not up to me. This Communication Management Unit Corcmus is a small unit that is segregated from the population of FCI- Marion (a medium security institution in Southern Illinois). From what I have heard, there are only 10 people there, inmates get one phone call a week, one 4-hour visit per month and their mail is under strict surviellance. I can speculate all day why they are sending me there but I wont. Better I get there and hear their stated reasons for housing me at a cestrictive and punitive unit. There is hardly any thing on live about the CMU although there is a similar unit here at Terre House called a "CTU" for thuse convicted of terror crimes. There was a stocy about the CMU IN the Eugene Weekly a few months back-ask Jenny for the link.

I'm happy to hear about the updates. Is this the same person who used to be involved with the Eaith First! Journal years ago? The name sounds really familiar. Your final list of names is a solid one. I know you were looking to be inclusive of female prisoners and while I think that's ideal - you can't force it. People who have cases in appeal are in a delicate situation, for screand the appeal and freedom needs to trump participation in projects like this. Your final list has some good writers lor at least ones I enjoy!). Atleast, with Jeff involved, I can rest easy my handwithing won't be the worst!

You ask about Sadie, I'm sure my critique has something to do with her excusing herself from the project. Only she can answer that though, we haven there in any confact for over 11/2 years and I opted to ignore her can't directed at me published in the E.F. Journal Some months ago. For what its north, she doesn't do any thing without his approval/participation so that may have something to do with it.

Are you talking about potential authors or the people you selected you mentioned in your last letter?

Thanks for the atticle about the CMU yer enclosed. There are now 2 of these units that I know of one here, and the one mentioned in the asticle at Terrethade. As for this unit, there are 14 other people here. Most of the men here are Muslim and almost everyone here has a case that is "kerrorism" related. It's pretty calm here and people get along fine. It is a bizarre place as we only have access to 2 wings (essentially, hallowys). We have single-cells, TVs with able, some recreation equipment, a small, limited lessore library, law library and a small concrete yard. The yard is all concrete, with 3 baskethall cages and a handball court as well. I've been playing a lot of baskethall lately and getting quite good! It reminds me of the countress afternoons spirit playing ball in Rochaway and Floshing growing up

The worst part of this place is how they manage our communications. I neverget in any truble at Sandstone or even got a mail violation so gotting sint here was odd. I am only given one phone call a week (15 minutes long) that needs to be pre-scholukel, and is live-monitored by staff. We can only call from 8 am- 23 open, on weekdays and not on haldays (no Christmas call home to family this year "). To give you a comparising to minutes of phone time is 1/5 of what I had at the low-security prison I was at. (Even people at a U.S. Penchatay have 300 minutes).

Visiting is limited to one 4-hour, non-contact (through glass) visit a month that is recorded and live-monitored by staff. Again, to compare, I had 56 potential hours a month of visiting! Yikes. It was incredibly painful to see Jenny through glass - to not be able to hugher or smell her perfure the hair. Sigh. The visit went so fast and I shuffled back to my unit knowings he had a 21/2 drive back to St. Louis coupled with a 21/2 flight in bad weather.

So far, my mail has been delivered in a timely fashion. It is scanned to revenue by staff and they have been clear that any mail that "promotes violence and property destruction" will be rejected. That's fine -I don't read that promotes violence.

There are times I feel this is all designed to beat me down, to isolate me from my family and friends and to distroy my spirit. Certainly, many people have it was e-interms of sentences, conditions, lack of support. I'm thuly lucky to have what I have and I know it so I take day by day-which is really the only way to do time. PURPOSE AND SCOPE This Institution Supplement establishes guidelines and procedures for the operation and security of the Communication Management Unit (CMU) in I Unit, at the United States Penitentiary, Marion, Illinois.

The CMU is established to house inmates who, due to their current offense of conviction, offense conduct, or other verified information, require increased monitoring of communication between inmates and persons in the community in order to protect the safety, security, and orderly operation of Bureau facilities, and protect the public.

The CMU is a self-contained general population housing unit where inmates reside, eat, and participate in all educational, recreational, religious, unit management, and work programming within the confines of I Unit. Additionally, the unit contains a block of cells located on B Range which are dedicated to segregated housing of those inmates in need of being placed in administrative detention or disciplinary segregation status.

# 3. RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY

A. <u>ADMISSION & ORIENTATION / CLASSIFICATION AND REVIEWS</u>: The East Corridor Unit Manager is responsible for administering the Admission and Orientation Program (A&O) in compliance with national policy. The purpose of the program is to familiarize each inmate with the unit staff, unit procedures, expected behavior, and programs available. All items on the A&O Checklist will be covered and utilized for verification of participation. As part of A&O, I-Unit inmates will receive a copy of this Institution Supplement and an A&O Handbook.

Classification and reviews of I-Unit inmates will occur according to national policy. Additionally, within five calendar days of arrival, I-Unit inmates will be provided a "NOTICE TO INMATE OF TRANSFER TO COMMUNICATION MANAGEMENT UNIT" form indication the reasons for their placement in the unit. A blank copy of the form is included with this Institution Supplement, Attachment "A".

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B. <u>CONTACT WITH PERSONS IN THE COMMUNITY:</u> The purpose of the CMU in I Unit is to provide increased monitoring of communication of the inmates assigned to it. By operating a self-contained housing unit, staff may adequately regulate and monitor all communications between inmates and persons in the community. All contact between I-Unit inmates and persons in the community may occur according to national policy, with necessary adjustments indicated herein. <u>Under no circumstances will privileged attorney-client communication be monitored</u>, as prohibited by national policy.

- (a) Written General Correspondence. All incoming and outgoing written general correspondence must be reviewed by staff prior to delivery to the inmate or further processing to the post office.
- (b) Telephone Communication. All telephone communication between inmates and persons in the community (except properly placed, unmonitored legal calls) will be:
  - (1) conducted using monitored ITS phone lines;
  - (2) be live-monitored by staff;
  - (3) be subject to recording by staff; and
  - (4) occur in English-only (by both the inmate and community call-recipient) unless previously scheduled for and conducted through simultaneous translation monitoring.

Persons from whom an inmate requests placement on the approved telephone list must complete the "Acknowledgment of Conditions for Telephone Contact with Inmates in the Communication Management Unit, USP Marion," form included with this Institution Supplement as Attachment "B", as proof of their acknowledgment and acceptance of these conditions. Monitored calls where either party speaks in non-English will be immediately terminated by the staff monitor unless previously scheduled and conducted through simultaneous translation monitoring. In the event of terminated calls, inmates may be subject to disciplinary action, and the person may be removed from the inmate's approved telephone list.

In no event will the frequency or duration of telephone calls placed by I-Unit inmates be less than one telephone call per month (28 C.F.R. 540.100 (b) of at least three minutes duration (28 CFR 540.101 (d). Unmonitored legal calls are not affected, and will continue to be managed according to national policy.

- (c) Visiting. All visiting between inmates and persons in the community (except properly scheduled, unmonitored legal visits) will be:
  - (1) conducted in the main visiting room using non-contact facilities (i.e., secure partitioned rooms, telephone voice contact;
  - (2) be live-monitored by staff:
  - (3) be subject to recording by staff;
  - (4) occur in English-only (by both inmate and visitor) unless previously scheduled for and conducted through simultaneous translation monitoring.

Persons for whom an inmate requests placement on the approved visiting list must complete the "Acknowledgment of Conditions for Visiting with Inmates in the Communication Management Unit, USP Marion," form included with this Institution Supplement as Attachment "C," as proof of their acknowledgment and acceptance of these conditions. Monitored visiting where either party speaks in non-English will be immediately terminated by the staff monitor unless previously scheduled and conducted

through simultaneous translation monitoring. Ordinarily, visiting will be scheduled to occur on weekdays for two-hour periods. Each inmate is authorized four hours of visiting each month (two 2-hour visits or one 4-hour visit.)

- 4. HOUSING CONDITIONS / UNIT PROGRAMS / SERVICES: I Unit is a self-contained general population housing unit where inmates reside, eat, and participate in all educational, recreational, religious, unit management, and work programming within the confines of I Unit. All national policies apply to administration of I Unit, except as otherwise modified in this supplement as necessary to affect the unit's mission of increased monitoring of communications, and pursuant to the Warden's authority to make the necessary changes to protect the safety, security, and good order of the facility, or to protect the public.
  - (a) Cell Assignments: I-Unit inmates will be housed in single bunk cells. Additionally, the unit contains a range of cells dedicated to segregated housing of those inmates in need of being placed in administrative detention or disciplinary segregation status. Cells I02-010L thru I02-016L are designated as segregation housing for I-Unit inmates placed in administrative detention status or disciplinary segregation status.
  - (b) Health Services: Health Services staff will provide sick call in the morning within the unit five days a week (M-F). Medications will be delivered and/or administered in the unit twice daily. Inmates may request to be seen by a physician in the unit's medical examination room. Specialized services may be provided in the institutions's main health services unit as needed, under conditions which ensure I-Unit inmates' lack of contact with non-I-Unit inmates. Inmates who require examination will be seen in the examination room.
  - (c) Mental Health Services: Psychology staff will provide I-Unit inmates an initial psychological assessment within 14 days of arrival in the unit for new commitments and within 30 days for transfers. Mental health services thereafter will occur according to national policy. Inmates may request to be seen by a psychology staff member in the unit's medical examination room.
  - (d) Meals: All inmate meals will be served and consumed in the unit.
  - (e) Education/Recreation Services: National education policies will be implemented in I Unit. Inmates will ordinarily be permitted to leave their cells and participate in activities in the unit daily from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., except during counts.

Leisure and law library services will be provided to inmates daily. Photocopies may be obtained by submitting a Request to Staff Member form to the law librarian or the Case Manager.

Inmates will be provided table games such as chess, checkers and cards. Hobby craft opportunities will also be provided.

There are 11 televisions available in the unit for viewing. The recreational areas will contain various

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recreation activities to include handball, stationary biking, stair-stepping machines, and walking.

- **(f) Religious Services.** National religious services policies will be implemented in I Unit. All communication with religious services providers from the community will be monitored as indicated in Section 3 of this Institution Supplement.
- (g) Personal Property. National personal property policies will be implemented in I Unit. Inmates are allowed to maintain up to three cubic feet of legal material in their cell. Temporary additional space for active litigation material may be requested from the Case Manager.
- (h) Commissary/Trust Fund Operations. National commissary and trust fund operation policies will be implemented in I Unit. Each inmate will be afforded the opportunity to purchase allowable items from the commissary if funds are available in the inmate's commissary account. Commissary purchase forms will be issued on Tuesday of each week by the Case Manager, and after completion of the forms they will be hand-delivered by the Case Manager to the commissary for processing by COB Wednesday. The commissary items will be delivered to the unit and handed out by commissary staff on Thursday of each week. Any special purchases (personal radios, etc.) must be approved by the Case Manager.
- (i) Sanitation. I-Unit inmates are responsible for sanitation of their living areas. Unit orderly job assignments will be made by the Case Manager. Inmate showers will be available daily. Clean, serviceable clothing will be issued to each inmate upon his arrival to the unit. Unit laundry service will be available for issued clothing on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. I-Unit inmates are responsible for laundering their own personal clothing. Barber services for I Unit will be conducted within the unit. Inmates should submit an Inmate Request to Staff form at least one week in advance of the desired time for a haircut. An inmate from within the unit will be the barber.
- (j) Work Assignments. Work assignments will include orderlies for unit sanitation, Food Service, laundry and recreation, and will be assigned by the Case Manager.
- ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDY PROGRAM: You may appeal your transfer to I Unit, or any
  conditions of your confinement, through the Bureau's Administrative Remedy Program, 28 C.F.R. 542.10
  through 542.19, and corresponding policy. Your case manager will provide you with the necessary form
  upon request.



### New Bureau of Prisons Rule Discloses Policies and **Conditions in Experimental Segregation Units**

Units Continue to Target Muslims, Activists, Restrict Communication and Forbid Physical Contact with Family Without Due Process

April 6, 2010, Washington, D.C.— Over three years after opening secretive "Communications Management Units," or "CMUs," the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP) took one step toward correcting its illegal and discriminatory segregation of Muslims and political prisoners by opening its actions to public scrutiny. The Center for Constitutional Rights (CCR) challenged the CMUs for violations of fundamental constitutional rights, including the right to due process, in a lawsuit filed last week.

The lawsuit, which is called Aref v. Holder, raises a number of substantial constitutional claims and also states that the units were created in violation of federal law, because the public was not given the requisite opportunity to learn about the CMUs and comment on the soundness of the proposed policy. Attorneys say the BOP's late attempt to correct that omission by proposing a rule disclosing CMU policy is an implicit acknowledgment that the units are unparalleled in the federal prison system, and an admission that the BOP violated the law by operating the unique units secretly for more than three years.

"While we welcome the BOP's decision to finally comply with its legal obligations—albeit over three years too late-the proposed rule does not make these experimental isolation units constitutional," said CCR staff attorney Alexis Agathocleous. "Our clients' experiences clearly demonstrate the abusive and arbitrary nature of the CMUs." For example, the proposed rule states that CMU prisoners, when possible, are provided a detailed explanation of the information that has led to their designation. In reality, many prisoners have simply been told that their designation was based on "reliable evidence." Their requests to be told the nature of this evidence are denied. Others received an explanation for their designation that included factually incorrect information, with no opportunity for correction.

The men detained in the CMUs have heavily restricted telephone and visitation access, and are categorically forbidden from hugging, touching or embracing their children or spouses during visits. Attorneys say this blanket ban on contact visitation, which is unique in the federal prison



system, not only causes suffering to the families of the incarcerated men, but is a violation of fundamental constitutional rights. The units are also being used overwhelmingly to hold Muslim prisoners and prisoners with unpopular political beliefs.

Family members of some CMU prisoners expressed surprise that the proposed rule did not acknowledge the blanket ban on contact visitation that has been in effect at both CMU units since their inception. "I haven't been able to hug my husband, or even hold his hand, for two years," said Jenny Synan, the spouse of a CMU prisoner and a plaintiff in the lawsuit. "This proposed rule does not explain how prohibiting a husband from holding his wife's hand or keeping a father from hugging his daughter, is necessary for prison security."



#### Dear Kelly –

Sorry its been such a long time since I've written, the last few months in here have been tolerable, but still I'm having my usual hard time at being away from my family – especially my son. I've spent a lot of time in recent weeks thinking about your project and I hope this letter will become something that you could use. I have been thinking of my contribution being like any other piece I have written, but in the spirit of the project I thought maybe I should just write a letter telling you what has been going on inside me, inside here. So, here I am, again in federal prison, the same prison I actually spent time in 14 years ago when I was first extradited to Michigan for my first federal case. A whole different world back then. Just weeks after having ended my time underground with a future 4 years in prison to come. Back then, I was the first animal liberationist to be in federal prison. Now I am just another of the many. And while prison hasn't changed that much, I know that I have. My path to prison began almost 25 years ago when I first chose to be a part of a movement that would risk imprisonment in the name of defending the Earth. For a child who loved this land and the animals on it and who was coming to terms with what our present day society was doing to the natural world, my evolution seems reasonable. What differentiated me from the many others like me who chose lives and professions protecting the environment albeit legally, I largely accredit to my heritage as an indigenous person,

but equally a student of U.S. history. A student who learned early the price a civilization is willing to pay to attain wealth and progress. And although the costs of such imperialism can be traced back further than the inception of this notion, my personal conviction to the suffering of my human relations on this continent has made me extremely sympathetic to the suffering of the land and animals here. So as a witness to the injustices of my own generation, the path of physical resistance to such crimes against nature was only natural. I came to age as a young adult as a student of Geronimo and Paul Watson. My mentors were historically Crazy Horse and Sitting Bull, but as contemporary leaders such as Dave Foreman and Cleveland Amory. In retrospect, I can now see how that time was an awakening. The rebirth of a spirit that had been haunting this nation ever since the crimes of Wounded Knee, the Trail of Tears, the Long Walk and the disappearance of the great bison herds and wild rivers and forests that reminded the new animals to the continent that humans were

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but one species in the great fabric of nature. As a youth raised to honor Earth and her Animal People you can imagine my shock when I first witnessed the slaughter of newborn harp seals, the harpooning of the worlds last great whales. I can't convey to you how many times I cried for the victims of the world I was growing up into. I had already been taught what had been done to us, the indigenous people who lived with Earth as Mother, now I was seeing the war being waged against those who still lived in harmony with all life. But in my teachings I had also learned of the bravery and courage of the many men and women who gave their lives – and freedom to protect not only their families, but also their very way of life. I had learned of the insurmountable odds found by the indigenous warriors of this country and who despite those odds fought a war that might have cost them their land and lives, but not their spirit. Now that spirit had risen. In the hearts of all people who still felt sorrow and pain at the destruction of a natural world and her relations that spirit awakened once more the desire to risk our lives for what we believed in. It's important for me to state that this is not my attempt to encourage others to do the things I have done. I was taught that no person can tell another what to do. This is just a story. My story of how and why I chose to sacrifice the privilege I was born into. The privilege that most of us rarely even recognize. The privilege of <u>not</u> having to fight to protect our lives, land and liberty. While others see these privileges as a way to work within the system to achieve change, I saw instead the need to act now to bring to light the injustice I couldn't live with. Knowing that however just the

need to protect our life support system for present and future generations might be, when there was money to be made by special interests with access to political power, the Earth, animals and even us would always come secondary or last. The important thing to remember is that no change is borne solely from one individual's effort. Change is a process that begins when a small community of people are willing to take unnecessary risk and unpopular action. We can look back on history and with the luxury of hindsight know that it was wrong to enslave other people or deny them basic human rights on the basis of their skin color or gender. But to believe such fundamental truths at a time when they are not only unpopular but also illegal is what brings that process of much needed change. There today are still many who believe that global threats to our planet are politically motivated hoaxes

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or at best, bad science. But if its one thing modern technology has given us that we cannot deny, it is the ability to see how our unlimited growth and development has burdened our environment in such a way that we force environmental illness and catastrophe previously unknown to man. And how that growth and development not only affects us, but those in far off lands whose environment and economies are exploited and manipulated to provide to us the very lifestyles that allows us to continue on this destructive path. In my life I have not expected to ever share my views with mainstream culture. I have always known that the path I and others chose to follow would make us societal pariahs. The belief that the way of life this country allows us and encourages is also our society's ultimate downfall is a belief that contradicts everything our society has stood for not to mention an admittance that an economy is built not to protect us, but the interests of people who are willing to sacrifice the safety of their children for short term gain. It has always been a fore drawn conclusion that to challenge popular belief is to sacrifice personal safety. We have seen these truths made evident anytime the motivations of this way of life has been called into question. And that is the choice I made when I decided to break the laws of my own country for what I believed. Perhaps I was able to do this because I was young and naïve. Perhaps my entire life experience that has led to three federal convictions and 5 ½ years in prison was a mistake. But what I chose to believe is that like those young and naïve people before me who believe that past-legalized injustices were morally and ethically wrong, our naiveté can sometimes provide the investigation society needs to truly question oneself. That our youthful ignorance of the slow process of change we are taught we must abide is sometimes just what that process needs to move those wheels forward. And so it was that I entered the world as a

member of direct action groups who freely and separately broke the law to defend what was and is still wild and free. It's an easy path to romanticize and that is why I am careful not to encourage it. For there is nothing romantic about spending 5 long years in prison away from the very loves and freedoms you

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have fought for. Nor is there any glory to be had from choosing a life where you or worse others might lose their lives because of your actions. I admit despite this, to have made decisions that unfairly put others at danger of great harm and it is because of such actions that I wish us never to think of ourselves as above the laws of man or nature. For no one man can know but his own truth and what he believes to be right. We can believe that we are acting in the best interests of others, but when our way involves force, we can dangerously begin to sound like those we set out to oppose. Secondly, there can be no illusion that however just your actions of today might be viewed by yourself or others in present or the future, to take action against a dominant paradigm will surely lead to persecution. I say this to clarify that however my actions might have been intended, there will always be consequences we might not anticipate. And however I might justify what I have done. I still am looking for and learning a better way to achieve my means. When I saw ancient forests being destroyed or my animal relations starved, tortured and imprisoned, passion can become a motivating force. And that is what I plead guilty too. I can't deny that it felt good to send pirate whaling ships to the bottom of the ocean. Or spirit animals away from cages to see them returned to the wild. But in taking those actions, I had to also accept responsibility for them and that meant a long time in prison. For every action there is a reaction and my path of radical environmentalism is a road map of how our society has responded to actions in defense of the Earth. All just causes have had their actions devised of passion more than strategy. The Boston Tea Party was one of them. And historically we remember not the repression brought down upon the participants, but the spirit and action itself. My life and that of a handful of others has been a history of both. When I first went to prison in 1995, I remained a part of the underground movement I had been imprisoned for, not in action, but in voice. I saw it as my responsibility to represent the environment and animals many were still risking their lives and freedom to protect. Pandora's box was opened and radical environmentalists had won their place on the political spectrum. But it has not come without a price. As our actions increased, so did the efforts of law - enforcement agencies to stop us. For this I do not believe we have become the victim, for as warriors choosing to fight as we did we must accept the

consequences for the path of our choosing. As I have said before, history tells us of the consequence for challenging the laws of a

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powerful nation. For me personally this meant leaving the movement we had created had become enough of a force that not just its actions, but the words I gave to it became equally volatile. None can deny that our actions of the last century have radically altered our environment and unleashed a chain reaction of effect that we are still just beginning to understand. For those of us who saw this disregard for the future generations of all life, as a threat to our planets very existence, action became more than a choice but an obligation, despite the consequence. When I left prison in 1999, I continued my spokesmanship for the cause of radical environmentalism and it wasn't long before I realized how much of a threat our actions had become. Not only for the damage they caused but for the climate they created among the business practices misdeeds with irreversibly altering our environment. Many more people would go to prison. Already the strength of our movement had been demonstrated at the World Trade Organization meeting in Seattle and it wouldn't be long before radical environmentalists and animal rights activists would be labeled the U.S. most active domestic terrorists. And then the actions on Sept. 11, 2001 forever would alter America's political landscape. Suddenly, "Homeland security" and fighting terrorism became as important to this nation as suppressing Native Americans was in the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century. Despite the commitment of radical environmentalists to harm no life, our actions were politically contextualized in the same light as those who flew planes into buildings. When I was arrested for interfering with a mountain lion hunt in Arizona in 2004, my actions were identical to those I had repeatedly carried out in the 1980's with the greatest legal repercussion being a misdemeanor citation resulting in a small fine at the most. Instead I saw my arrest transformed into a federal felony charge of ecoterror for which I would be sent to federal prison for 8 months. Before my sentencing I would also be federally indicted in a terrorism offence for delivering the speech that I presently am in prison for. Both prosecutions were a reflection of the U.S. government – meant to make an example of those who encourage lawless activity to defend the Earth. During this same time, Operation Back Fire was executed by the FBI and many alleged members of the Earth Liberation Front brought to justice. What hasn't stopped despite these arrests and prosecutions is the level of awareness towards environmental destruction

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that they all sought to highlight. It's not secret that the radical environmental movement was a small core of individuals who largely know each other and who in similar ways evolved from middle classes of the society they opposed. Much in the same way that the first advocates for the abolition of slavery were those who witnessed it first-hand, so too were many of us in the radical environmental mov't witnesses to the destruction of the best pristine eco-systems of Earth. When I first went to sea in 1985, I read journals from the 1800's describing the populations of great whales in the water I sailed so prolific as to pose a navigational hazard. Yet the oceans around me revealed so few whales as to cause great excitement when we'd see just one. Such revelations were the reasons behind my actions against pirate whalers. Now we are in a political climate where corporate influence media and law-enforcement agencies flush with huge budgets to fight domestic terrorism easily abroad such actions in the context of terrorism with extreme punishment routed out to individuals who have injured not a single human being. But our purpose is not lost. It must simply evolve. No longer must we grab the American public by the shoulders and slap them into awareness of the threats posed to our future, instead the facts that our planet is in peril were ignored and denied by only the most irresponsible of citizens. What remains to be done is how to change it. And rather than continue to attack the very institutions engaged in environmental irresponsibility, we must demonstrate through our own actions the timehonored behavior of living in harmony with nature. At the heart of our concern for the Earth and our own future is a desire to live in peace, knowing that the future of our children is secured. It was true hundreds of years ago as it is still true today. The ways we have gone about achieving that goal are all that should be determined. When the situation called for direct intervention, we were there to do it – and pay the price. I believe it is now the time to demonstrate the way of living we believe is possible instead of attacking the ways we fault. Lets hope the attention we have helped draw to the greatest threats to our future existence will not fall on deaf ears. What is left for us to do is to speak to those ready to listen. When I became a father I first thought that having a child would stand in the way of

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my being a warrior. Instead I have learned that by having fulfilled the obligations I did in my early years, I had prepared myself for the next task as a warrior, that of raising a family. For no warrior is worth much if his or her fighting is not for the betterment of others. It was true hundreds of years ago

and it remains true today. When I looked into my child's eyes and saw the hope of a new generation, I knew the ways of harmony with peace on Earth were not going to be taught to my children through acts of war. Any war, no matter how just. The true ways of love, peace, and compassion and harmony with others can only be learned through example. My children did not need to learn how corporations are given greater legal rights than a forest or community, they need to know how to live in harmony with that forest and community. The lessons we have to teach our children and others who will listen, are the same lessons that countless generations of indigenous peoples have practiced in return for a way of life and civilization that outlasted any of modern man whose path would have gone on much longer had they not been extricated by the same short-sighted mess now plaguing our society today. But that knowledge of harmony with life on Earth was not lost. It was forced to hide during the time when practicing such a belief in this country was banned right the middle of the last century. Still, you cannot hide or ban something that is in our hearts, the sense of knowing or feeling that we have become dangerously disconnected from that which matters most to us. And as my generation matured with this sickness of spirit we cried and felt the pain for what we know was being lost. And now we have the power to erase that pain from future generations by giving to them a way of living that does not rely on the exploitation or destruction of our environment for short – term gain. In the darkest times of the Indian wars in this century, what our people fought for was the right to raise our children to believe in the ways handed down to us from our ancestors, the ways that reminded us of our relationship to the Earth and her children of all races, species and creation. And it was that love, that desire for such a future for our children that led our strongest warriors to lay down their weapons, despite the darkness that loomed ahead.

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And through that darkness the culture and traditions of living in harmony with Earth have not only survived, they have thrived. They have erased all boundaries of race, class and culture to give to many a dream of living as if all other life mattered. But those dreams will remain only dreams without the brave people to lead us into an era of new awakening – a new era back to old ways. But not old as to be in the past, but old as in the ways that have provided survival and sustenance to countless generations. When I accepted a plea bargain with the U.S. Gov't in 2007 it was also for me a peace treaty. A treaty that not only promised my cessation of fighting, but a hope for living beyond war. I have spent the better part of the last 25 years fighting against the institutions that were

destroying the natural world, now it is time for us to create the way of life that will outlast any battle. I believe it is the same hope that was shared by all indigenous ancestors of ours who also were forced to realize that war was not the answer. Let there be no doubt. We honor those who have gone before us. Those who have carried the torch of hope in darker times than we have ever known, and I pray we will ever know again. Their sacrifice should never be forgotten, but more importantly what should not be forgotten is what they sacrificed for. What cannot be denied is that all of us who have spent time in prison for defending the Earth were not motivated by selfgain or material profit and however reckless or dangerous our actions, we stood at the end of the day to accept responsibility for them and explain that our motivation was for the love of the people and places we cared for the most. Our love for the hopes and dreams of future generations cannot be denied. We will pay the price we must, but in the hopes and dreams of our children our vision for a better world survives. The places we have loved, where our hearts broke open to the spirits of those who walked before us are places that all our hearts cry for. Without them we suffer a great starvation of spirit. And because of that love we have come to the kind of captivity and control that we fear for others. I think a lot about my son, Anheles Zeibrig Hekakawi. His name Hekakawi, was given to him at his traditional "baptismal" where he was offered to the Four Directions and the Earth and Sun. It means "Wind that comes off the Mountain." Sometimes

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I have watched that wind blow over him as he looks out into the world that he will grow up into. I wonder what kind of world that will be and whether it will be better or worse than the one I was exposed to. When Anhel was four years old. I had just come home one day from filming the sport "hunting" of sandhill cranes in Southern Arizona that migrate there each year in the thousands. Our effort was to expose to the public the barbarity in shooting these beautiful birds whose wing span can reach six feet. I needed to transfer the tape from my camera to tapes to be distributed and told Anhel not to watch because it was sad to see, but he insisted. He wanted to see what I was doing. As I watched this little innocent child sit down cross-legged and witness what I had seen earlier that day, I wanted to cry because he was already learning of the cruelty of man towards nature. I don't want him to have to grow up in such a world, yet to shelter him from it is getting harder and harder each day. He knows why I am in prison and doesn't want me to continue to do the things I have done to get here. I've looked into his eyes, like thousands of indigenous fathers have looked into their children's eyes, wishing only to protect them from the

pain and suffering that we have known. For the children, we have laid down our weapons with the hope for a brighter day. One where our beliefs and way of living will not lead to a war against us. The best we can do is live our lives as we believe we should, causing the least amount of harm to others, be they animal, man, river or forest. How others choose to live is outside our control. The best lesson we can offer is our own vision practiced in such a way that it will encourage others to join us. We know what those who destroy the earth have to offer. Now let us show others what living in harmony with Earth can promise us all. In my letters from my wife she talks about the dream of living in a house alive with the voices and footsteps of our children as they rush outside to lay under an orchard and gorge on fresh fruit, or dash into the woods or some adventure only the innocence of youth can create. Behind them lie our crops, rising towards the sun, the bounty of nature that will hopefully see us through another winter. At dusk we will gather around our dinner table and give thanks for the life the Earth provides to us as we hold hands and drink in the warmth of each others love and the food before us. At night we will sit around our fire and tell them the stories our elders have handed down

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to us and in the day we will live the lessons taught in those very same stories. Should the day ever come when the world we know has changed for the worse, be it human industrial-induced climate change, raging desertification, more disastrous hurricanes and floods or ecological collapse or a chain reaction of species extinction unravels the web of nature, our children will rightly so question the wisdom of this passing generation and wonder what was possibly more important than protecting the land we live on. I hope than my son and daughter will be proud to have been part of the solution and not the problem and forgive me for the 5½ years I spent in prison fighting for their future. And rather then be bitter and angry at what others have done, I'll hope the life I had led, like that of my ancestors will allow them to teach their

children the ways that will continue to keep alive the hope that only living in harmony with nature and each other can give us. This is what I can change and that's all I want to do anymore. Give them that hope that was first born in each one of us maybe when we sat in that ancient forest for the very first time, saw that hawk soar into the sunset or just played in the woods behind our home. After 25 years, thats what I believe we can best do for our children and future generations. Its taken me a long time to get here, but like those warriors who made those difficult decisions that allowed our ways to survive, its what I believe we can do. Because one day these steel doors are going to roll open for each one of us and will re-enter a world a lot different from how it was before. And not just our children but many others will be looking for a way out of this mess that irresponsible people got us into. Our task has always been to try and speak for the earth so that others will listen. No one said it was going to be easy. Not a lot of people think of Geronimo as a father and a husband. They remember him as a warrior. Likewise people like me might not be remembered for what we did after prison, but more for the actions that led us here. But I now know why Geronimo and others like him fought all those years. Why he would run from the reservations, not only with his warriors but with their families. Because it was the only way his people could live as they believed. Knowing the comfort of the Earth, the security that comes from living

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close to nature, with love, reliance and an interdependence on each other as well as the land around you. The dream of living wild and free. Our struggle is not defined in what we oppose, but in what we create. What I have stood for my entire life has not changed, it just became clearer. And these are principles I will never surrender. It is in memory of my ancestors and for the hopes and dreams of our children. Dreams that continue when this prison sentence ends. We may have fought for the way things were, but now we live to remind others how they can be again.
